After we completed the first mosaic with Nadine and Georg the AYISE volunteers were really enthused to keep 'mosaic-ing'. A new project was conceived to build a second peace mosaic at the Bangwe youth Centre. So a NEW peace mosaic to rival the first was completed late last year as a collaborative project between Malawian and volunteers from Wales. The image some 3metres by 4 ½ metres shows two hands (1 back one white) grasping hands with the words "Imagine This" at the bottom. It looks totally GREAT!!

We are now looking at landscape the area surrounding it (taking cutting from the garden at AYISE – very clever!) as it is the rainy season and we want to take advantage of the rains and get the plants established.

Here we are breaking up the soil and planting our cutting. Now a plan, some rock gardens and some new plants.
